Getting started

Location


Place your BT Freestyle 710 within 2 metres of the mains power socket and telephone socket so that the cables will reach.

Make sure it is at least 1 metre away from other electrical appliances to avoid interference.

Your BT Freestyle 710 works by sending radio signals between the handset and base. The strength of the signal depends on where you site the base. Putting it as high as possible ensures the best signal.

Setting up

 Plug the mains power cable into the socket marked P on the underside of the base and plug the other end into the mains power wall socket and switch the power on. You can place the cable behind the retaining clip to prevent the plug being accidentally pulled from the socket.



WARNING

Do not place your BT Freestyle 710 in the bathroom or other humid areas.

Handset range

The BT Freestyle 710 has a range of 300 metres outdoors when there is a clear line of sight between the base and handset. Any obstruction between the base and handset will reduce the range significantly. With the base indoors and handset either indoors or outdoors, the range will normally be up to 50 metres. Thick stone walls can severely affect the range.

IMPORTANT

The base station must be plugged into the mains power socket at all times. Do not connect the telephone line until the handset is fully charged. Only use the power and telephone cables supplied with the product.

Battery low warning

If the **constant** icon flashes in the handset display you will need to recharge the handset before you can use it again. You also hear a low battery warning beep once every 60 seconds.

During charging, the **cance** icon will scroll in the display.

Battery perfor `mance

In ideal conditions, fully charged batteries should give up to 10 hours talk time or 100 hours standby time on a single charge.

Note that new batteries do not reach full capacity until they have been in normal use for several days. To keep the batteries in the best condition, leave the handset off the base for a few hours at a time. Running the batteries right down at least once a week will help it last as long as possible.

The charge capacity of rechargeable batteries will reduce with time as they wear out, giving the handset less talk/standby time. Eventually they will need to be replaced. New batteries are available from the BT Freestyle 750 Helpline on 0800 218 2182*. After charging your handset for the first time, subsequent charging time is about 6–8 hours a day. Batteries and handset may become warm during charging. This is normal. The base indicator lights up.

- 2. Batteries will come inserted in the battery compartment. Pull the plastic tag as instructed to activate the batteries.
- Place the handset on the base to charge for at least 20 hours. When the handset is fully charged the _____ icon will be displayed.
- When the batteries are fully charged, plug one end of the telephone line cord into the socket marked the on the rear of the base and the other end into the telephone wall socket.



Setting up for multiple packs

If you have purchased a BT Freestyle 710 multiple pack, you will need to prepare any additional handsets and chargers for use.

For each additional handset and charger:

 Insert the cable through the channel at the rear of the charger and insert the plug into the power socket. Plug the other end into the mains wall power socket and switch on.



2. Batteries will come inserted in the battery compartment. Pull the plastic tag as instructed to activate the batteries. Charge the battery for at least 20 hours.

Any additional handsets supplied as part of a multipack are pre-registered to the base so, once charged, are ready for use. The handset number is shown in the display.

Your BT Freestyle 710 is ready for use.

Using your BT Freestyle 710 on a Broadband line?

If this product is to be used on a broadband line then you must ensure that it is connected via an ADSL microfilter. Using this product on a Broadband line without an ADSL microfilter may cause problems with this product and your Broadband service.

Back/Clear/Mute Delete numbers and characters.

When on a call, press once to mute the handset and again to switch the handset microphone back on.

When in a menu, press to cancel and return to previous menu level.

Phonebook

Press to open the phonebook, page 22.

Talk/Handsfree

Press to make and receive calls.

In talk mode, press to switch handsfree speaker on and off, page 17.





Navigating the menus

Your BT Freestyle 710 has an easy to use menu system.

Each menu has a list of options, which you can see on the menu map on the following page.


When the handset is switched on and in standby:

- 1. Press **Menu** to open the main menu.
- 2. Then use or buttons to scroll through the available options.
- 3. Press the Menu option button to select a menu option or the KBack button to return to the previous screen.

To exit a menu and return to standby, press o


Up and Down buttons

Press the \square and \square buttons on the side of the handset to scroll through the menu options.



If no buttons are pressed for 30 seconds the handset returns to standby automatically.

Using the phone

Switch handset on or off

To switch off

- 1. Press and hold a.
- 2. Switch off? is displayed, press Yes to confirm.

To switch on

- 1. Press and hold and.
- 2. Searching is displayed, then the screen will return to standby.

Make an external call

- 1. Press 📞 🖿 .
- 2. When you hear the dial tone, dial the number.

Preparatory dialling

- 1. Dial the number first. If you make a mistake press **XBack** to delete the last digit.
- 2. Press 🌜 🖬 to dial.

End a call

1. Press 👦 🧙

When you make a call, the Power/In use light on the base flashes.

Call timer

Your handset will automatically time the duration of all external calls. The handset display shows the call duration both during and for a few seconds after your call.

Auto answer

As long as you have auto answer set to ON you can answer a call by lifting the handset off the base. If you have switched auto answer off, you will need to press **Context** as well. Auto answer ON is the default setting. See page 32.

To switch your call waiting service on or off, see page 42.

Receive a call

When you receive a call, the phone rings. The display shows the caller's number if available or the caller's name if it matches an entry in the phonebook.

1. Press 📞 🖬 .

Call Waiting

Providing you have subscribed to your network's Call Waiting service and it is switched on, your BT Freestyle 710 will alert you to a second incoming call while you are already engaged on an external call.

- 1. You will hear the call waiting tone and the display will show the number of the caller, or the name if it matches an entry in your phonebook.
- 2. Press **R** to answer the new call and your first caller is put on hold.
- 3. Press **R** to toggle between the two callers.
- 4. Press and to hang up the current call.

Earpiece / handsfree volume

During a call you can adjust the volume of the earpiece or loudspeaker. There are 5 levels.

1. Press or vice to increase or decrease the volume.

Secrecy (Mute)

During a call, you can talk to someone nearby without your caller hearing.

- 1. Press **KBack**. The display shows Mute on and your caller cannot hear you.
- 2. Press **XBack** again to return to your caller.

Handsfree

Handsfree lets you talk to your caller without holding the handset. It also enables other people in the room to listen to your conversation over the loudspeaker.

Make a handsfree call

- 1. Dial the number then press Some. You hear your call over the handset loudspeaker. Press Some to switch the call between the earpiece and the loudspeaker.
- 2. Press and the call.

The and buttons can be found on the side of the handset.

During a handsfree call, press \square or \square to change the volume.

Answer a call handsfree

When the phone rings:

1. Press button to answer the call then press it again to switch to loudspeaker.

Switch to handsfree during a call

 During a call: press is to put the call on the loudspeaker. To switch handsfree off and return the call to the earpiece, press is again.

Redial

Up to the last 5 telephone numbers called are saved in the redial list. You can then select any of the numbers to redial, delete or copy to the phonebook.

Redial the last number called

- 1. Press the last number you called is displayed.
- 2. Press 🌜 🖬 to dial.

Redial a number from the redial list

- 1. Press A, the last number you called is displayed.
- 2. Press or vito scroll to the number you want.
- 3. Press 🌜 🖬 to dial.

Save a number from the redial list to the phonebook

- 1. Press . Scroll or to the number you want.
- 2. Press <a>Menu and scroll <a>to Store Number.
- 3. Press <a>Menu. Use the keypad to enter a name.
- 4. Press <a>Menu. Scroll <a> or <a> to select a Group if required.
- 5. Press Menu to save. Press Back to return to the previous menu level.

Delete a redial number

- 1. Press . Scroll or to the number you want.
- 2. Press <a>Menu and scroll <a> to Delete Number.
- 3. Press Menu to confirm or Back to cancel.

Store numbers up to 24 digits long and names up to 8 characters.

Press to delete any unwanted digits and then enter new ones using the keypad.

If the phonebook is full, the display shows Memory full and the number will not be saved. You will need to delete a number in the phonebook first, see page 25.

WARNING

If the keypad is locked you will be able to dial the emergency numbers 999 and 112.

When the keypad is locked you can still answer incoming calls and operate the handset as normal. When the call is ended, the keypad lock comes on again.

Delete all redial numbers

- 1. Press A.
- 2. Press <a>Menu and scroll <a> to Delete All.
- 3. Press <a>Menu to confirm or <a>Back to cancel.

Keypad lock

You can lock the keypad so that it cannot be used accidentally while carrying it around.

To lock the keypad:

1. Press and hold 🛄. The handset beeps and Keypad locked is displayed.

To unlock the keypad:

1. Press and hold 🔛. The handset beeps and Keypad unlocked is displayed for 2 seconds before returning to standby.

Find handset (Paging)

You can ring a handset to help locate it.

- 1. Press and the base. All handsets registered to the base will ring for up to 30 seconds.
- 2. Press a on the base again to stop the ringing or press a button on any handset.

New calls and messages alert

When you have new answering machine messages or calls, your BT Freestyle 710 displays details to access.

New call alert The screen shows New Call.

New message alert The screen shows New Mag.

Paging calls cannot be answered by a handset.

Phonebook

Entering names

Use the keypad letters to enter names, e.g. to store Tom: Press 🖗 once to enter T. Press 🎱 three times to enter o. Press 🚇 once to enter m.

Writing tips

Press S or S to move the cursor. Press S to switch between upper and lower case. Only one character is changed at a time. Press O to enter punctuation characters. Press O to insert a space. Press C to insert a space. Press C to insert a space.

You must enter a name to go with a number.

To enter a pause in a phonebook number

When storing a number press and hold and a P will be displayed.

For more information on pauses, see page 54.

Phonebook empty

If the phonebook is empty and you press Grantson, the display shows List empty for 2-3 seconds and then phonebook option New entry. Once an entry has been stored the full menu is displayed.

You can store up to 50 names and numbers in the phonebook. Names can be up to 8 characters long and numbers up to 24 digits.

Store a name and number

- 1. From standby, press Phonebook. The phonebook menu is displayed.
- 2. When storing the first entry: New entry is highlighted. Press Menu.

When storing further entries: The phonebook list is displayed, with the first entry highlighted. Press **Menu**. New Entry is highlighted. Press **Menu**.

- 3. Enter the name.
- 4. Press <a>Menu and enter the number.
- Press ✓Menu. If you don't want to store the number in a group, press ✓Menu. If you want to add the entry to a group, scroll v to the group you want then press ✓Menu.
- 6. Press **XBack** to return to the previous menu level.

View an entry

- 1. Press Phonebook. The first entry is displayed.
- 2. Press ✓Menu and scroll S to View.
- 3. Press ✓MenD. The first entry is displayed. Press S to display the number. Press S again to display the Group.
- 4. Press to dial the number or Back to return to the previous menu level.

View phonebook capacity

- 1. Press Phonebook. The first entry is displayed.
- Press Menn and scroll to Capacity and press Menn. The number of entries stored out of 50 is displayed.
- 3. Press **Back** to return to the previous menu level.

Dial an entry

- 1. In standby, press Phonebook. The first entry is displayed.
- 2. Scroll 🗛 or 🗣 to the entry you want or search alphabetically.
- 3. Press 🌜 🖬 to dial.

To search alphabetically

Press the relevant keypad button, e.g. for the entries beginning with T press ③ once then scroll or through the entries.

Call groups

Your options are: General Family Work Friends Utilities VIP Others No Group When editing a name or number, press to delete characters and digits.

You can copy an entry to another handset registered to the base.

If you copy an entry that already exists in the receiving handset it will create a duplicate entry.

Edit a name and number

- 1. Press Phonebook.
- 2. Press <a>Menu and scroll <a>to Edit Entry.
- 3. Press Menu and edit the name. Press Menu and edit the number.
- 4. Press Menu. If required, scroll v to the Group you want.
- 5. Press Menu to confirm then Back to return to the previous menu level.

Copy an entry

- 1. Press Phonebook. Scroll A or V to the entry you want.
- 2. Press ✓Menu and scroll ♥ to Copy.
- 3. Press Menu and select the handset you want to copy to and press Menu.

At the receiving handset:

- 4. Display shows Receive dir. Press www.eceivedir.example.com to confirm or www.eceivedir.example.com to confirm of www.eceivedir.example.com to confirm of wwwwwwwwwwwwwwwwwwww
- 5. When successful the display shows Copied.
- 6. Press Back to return to the previous menu level.

Copy all entries

- 1. Press Phonebook.
- 2. Press ✓Menu and scroll 🗸 to Copy All.
- 3. Press Menu and select the handset you want to copy to and press Menu.

At the receiving handset:

- 4. Display shows Receive entry?. Press Menu to confirm or KBack to cancel.
- 5. When successful the display shows Copied.
- 6. Press **Back** to return to the previous menu level.

Delete an entry

- 1. Press Phonebook. Scroll 🗛 or 🗣 to the entry you want.
- 2. Press <a>Menu and scroll <a>To Delete.
- 3. Press <a>Menu to confirm or <a>Back to cancel.
- 4. Press **Back** to return to the previous menu level.

You can copy the entire phonebook to another handset registered to the base.

If the phonebook becomes full during copying the display shows Memory full.

If copying is not successful the display shows Dir. copy failed.

If you copy an entry that already exists in the receiving handset it will create a duplicate entry.

Delete entire phonebook

- 1. Press Phonebook.
- 2. Press <a>Menu and scroll <a>to Delete All.
- 3. Press Menu. Display shows Delete All?.
- 4. Press Menu to confirm or Back to cancel.

Speed dial

You can allocate a name and number from the phonebook to each of the Speed dial buttons **2** to **9**.

Button **1** has the BT Freestyle Helpline number stored already. To ask BT for help with using your phone, press and hold **1** to ring the number.

To copy a phonebook entry to a Speed dial

- 1. Press Phonebook.
- 2. Scroll v to Speed Dial and press
- 3. Scroll or to the button number where you want to store the speed dial entry. Press wenu.
- 4. Scroll or to the entry you want to store and press Menu to confirm.
- 5. Press **XBack** to return to the previous menu level.

To delete a Speed dial

- 1. Press Phonebook.
- 2. Press <a>Menu and scroll <a> or <a> to Speed dial and press <a>Menu.
- 3. Scroll or or to the Speed dial you want to delete and press
- The name and number is displayed, press ✓Menu and scroll to Delete.
- 5. Press Menu to confirm, Deleted is displayed.
- 6. Press Back to return to the previous menu level.

To edit a Speed dial

- 1. Press Phonebook
- 3. Scroll S or S to the Speed dial you want to edit and press ✓Menu.
- 4. The name and number is displayed, press www.and.edit is displayed.
- 5. Press Menu to confirm, and then scroll or to the entry
 you want and press Menu to save.

- 6. This new name and number will replace the old name and number in the Speed dial.
- 7. Press **XBack** to return to the previous menu level.

To dial using a Speed dial

- 1. Press and hold the Speed dial button (2) to (2) with the number you wish to dial.
- 2. The display shows Calling and the number being dialled.

- 5. Scroll S or to the ringtone you want. A sample is played.
- 6. Press Menu to save.
- 7. Press **XBack** to return to the previous menu level.

Handset ringer volume

- 1. Press <a>Menu. Scroll <a>to Settings and press <a>Menu.
- 2. Display shows H/Set settings. Press <a>Menu.
- 3. Display shows Ringer. Press
- 4. Scroll Volume. Press Menu.
- 5. Scroll or to the level you want.
- 6. Press Menu to save.
- 7. Press **XBack** to return to the previous menu level.

Select the ringtone for External or

to choose from.

Internal calls. There are 10 ringtones

There are five volume levels plus Off.

Handset tones

- 1. Press <a>Menu. Scroll <a>to Settings and press <a>Menu.
- 2. Display shows H/Set settings. Press <a>Menu.
- 3. Scroll V to Tones. Press
- 4. Scroll A or v to the tone you want. Press
- 5. Scroll 🗛 or 🗣 to On or Off.
- 6. Press Menu to save.
- 7. Press **Back** to return to the previous menu level.

Select base

- 1. Press Menu. Scroll
 to Settings and press
- 2. Display shows H/Set settings. Press <a>Menu.
- 3. Scroll v to Select Base. Press
- 4. Scroll A or v to the Base you want. Press
- 5. Press **XBack** to return to the previous menu level.

Switch Key Beeps, Confirmation tones, Low Battery and Out of Range Warning tones on or off.

The default setting is On.

Your handset can be registered to up to 4 base stations. Select which base station you use. As long as you have auto answer set to ON you can answer a call by lifting the handset off the base. If you have switched auto answer off, you will need to press as well. Auto answer ON is the default setting.

Adjust the display contrast to suit different lighting conditions. There are 5 levels.

Auto answer

- 1. Press <a>Menu. Scroll <a>to Settings and press <a>Menu.
- 2. Display shows H/Set settings. Press <a>Menu.
- 3. Scroll 🗸 to Auto answer. Press 🗸 Menu.
- 4. Scroll A or v to select On or Off. Press <a>Menu.
- 5. Press **Back** to return to the previous menu level.

Display

Contrast

- 1. Press <a>Menu. Scroll <a>to Settings and press <a>Menu.
- 2. Display shows H/Set settings. Press <a>Menu.
- 3. Scroll 🗸 to Display. Press 🗸 Menu.
- 4. Display shows Contrast. Press
- 5. Scroll or to select the contrast. Press Menu.
- 6. Press **XBack** to return to the previous menu level.

Handset name

- 1. Press <a>Menu. Scroll <a>to Settings and press <a>Menu.
- 2. Display shows H/Set settings. Press <a>Menu.
- 3. Scroll ♥ to Display. Press ✓Menu.
- 4. Scroll v to Handset name. Press
- 5. Use the keypad to enter a name for your handset then press <a>Menu to save.
- 6. Press **Back** to return to the previous menu level.

Set a name for your handset, e.g. Donna or Office.

Choose from 5 base ringtones. There are 5 volume levels and Off.

The System PIN is used when changing certain settings and registration / deregistration. The default setting is 0000. You can change this to your own preferred 4-digit number.

If you make a mistake, press $\ensuremath{\texttt{Clear}}$ to delete digits.

Base settings

Ringtone and volume

- 1. Press <a>Menu, scroll <a>A to Settings and press <a>Menu.
- 2. Scroll v to Base settings. Press
